## Howard 2016-17 Staffing Updates

I'm pleased to announce that Howard has received more staffing for next school year, which means we will be able to lower some of our class sizes. Next year we'll have three class rooms at kindergarten, 1st, 2nd, and now 3rd grade, which will make for some nice smaller class sizes at those grade levels. At 4th and 5th grade we will have two at each grade level, with some additional facilitating teacher time.

Most teachers are staying at their current grade level for next year, but we did have a few teacher changes and one new hire. An exciting announcement that is also a nice feather in Howard's cap is that two of our teachers have been selected to be Teachers on Special Assignment (TOSAs) to work at the school district level for half of their work day. Allison Kreider will be the Elementary Science TOSA in charge of helping train teachers across 4J in using the newly adopted science curriculum, and Erin Gaston will be the Elementary English Language Arts TOSA in charge of training and coaching teachers across 4J in how to be better reading teachers. At 3rd grade, Allison will teach in the morning and in the afternoon, Stephanie Peterson, currently one half of the 4/5 blend teaching team, will be Allison's job-share partner and will teach in the afternoon. Also joining the 3rd grade team will be Robin Vauahan, our current Title 1 Coordinator, who will be teaching with Carla, Allison, and Stephanie. At 2nd grade, Angela Larsen and Mellissa Swift will continue in their positions and Erin is moving into a Title 1 teaching position. Taking her classroom position will be a returning Howard teacher, Ashley Pond, who since leaving Howard has taught 3rd grade and ATA for three years and more recently taught 3rd grade for four years at Gilham. Ashley is a strong teacher who we are all very excited to have back at Howard! In the Title 1 classroom, AJ Hruby is taking over for Robin Vaughn as our Title 1 Coordinator. Lastly, this coming year we will be hiring for a full-time counselor and also for a part-time teacher to provide additional support for our large upper grade classrooms. Everyone else will be back next year and working in their same positions. It's very exciting to see Howard continue to grow and to see how many great teachers want to come to our school!

## 2016-2017 Class Lists

In the past, Howard has sent out student class placement cards at the end of June for the upcoming school year, but this year we are going to wait until the fall to post class lists. This is because there is a possibility we might receive more staffing between now and the fall, in which case we might be reconfiguring class lists, particularly at 4th and 5th grade and want to make sure that the class placements we announce are correct.
